With respect to the Market at Watling Avenue, Burnt Oak, Edgware

BYE-LAWS

THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF HENDON in exercise of their powers under Section 61 of the Food and Drugs Act, 1955, hereby make the following byelaws:-

1. In these byelaws, except where the context otherwise requires -

"the Council" means the Borough Council of Hendon;

"market hours" means the hours appointed by the council for the holding of a market;

"sell" and "sale" include exposing and exposure for sale;

"stall" includes a building and standing.

2. Every fire and light used in connection with a stall shall be extinguished not later than half an hour after the market closes.

3. No person shall cleave any carcase or meat in the market place unless it is on a cleaving board or chopping block, or is properly attached to or suspended from hooks provided for the purpose.

- 4. Every tenant or occupier of a stall shall -
 - (a) cause the stall to be properly cleansed before and after market hours, and as often as may be necessary during those hours;
 - (b) cause all refuse from the stall, and all refuse arising from the loading and unloading of articles required in connection with the stall, to be placed in a receptacle provided by the council for the purpose.
- 5. On any day appointed for the holding of a market
 - (a) no vehicle shall be halted in any avenue or passage in the market place or in the immediate approaches thereto for longer than is reasonably required for the loading or unloading of articles;
 - (b) no private car shall, except for loading or unloading as permitted by the preceding provisions of this byelaw, be parked in the market place during the period from half an hour before to half an hour after market hours;
 - (c) no person shall bring into the market place or the immediate approaches thereto, or allow to stand therein, any animals or articles in such a manner as to cause obstruction.
- 6. No person shall wilfully throw or drop any waste fruit or vegetable matter, or any other market litter, in any avenue or passage in the market place in a manner likely to cause injury to any person.
- Any person who offends against any of the provisions of these byelaws shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five pounds.
